Independence Starts with Safety

- Security staff on duty every day, 24/7 (CPR/First Aid trained, required to wear photo identification).
- Keyless door locks with personal codes and entrance history.
- Security doors with deadbolt locks.
- Personal Assistance Emergency Communication System.
- Optional Daily Welfare Check System.
- Security camera monitoring of common areas.
- Entrance gates locked at night (except main entrance for emergency vehicles).
- Walk in/easy access showers with grab bars available.
- Multiple elevators throughout community.
- Smoke detectors/alarm system, checked every three months.
- Regular evacuation drills.
- Virtusense Technology—free assessments to identify fall risk and personalized fitness assistance.
- Balance classes to help prevent falls.
- Resource guidance for residents in personal crisis.
- Criminal background checks and drug testing for all staff.
- Master keys checked in/out at shift change.
- Criminal background check conducted on all residents prior to move-in.
- EMG (Emergency Management Guide) implemented for disaster preparedness.



Important things YOU can do for personal safety:

- Keep your doors locked at all times.
- Wear your emergency communication pendant at all times.
- Ask for identification and verify before letting unknown visitors in your apartment.
- Permission to enter at your discretion—if you prefer to be home when staff enters.
- Install cameras in your apartment.
 There are lots of options available including Amazon and Walmart.
- Report suspicious activity immediately. Call Security, push your pendant or call 911.
- Report theft immediately to Security at 480-861-8326 and Mesa PD 480-644-2211. Timely reporting is VERY important.
- Use a lock box for valuables including cash, jewelry and medication. Lock boxes available for \$25 and free installation.
